

### Message from Pastor Linda

As April begins, we are just over halfway through the season of Lent. The time in the wilderness continues, as we search for a deeper understanding of our relationship with God and what it means for the ways in which we live our lives. This is a time for reflection, for prayer, for confession. Christianity is a faith that is displayed in actions; actions of repentance and resolution to change are appropriate during this period of the church year. Following the suggestions on the Lenten calendar, we are practicing giving of ourselves and our possessions for the service of others and praying for God's creation in all its brokenness.

Holy Week is a whirl of activity. The excitement of the parade on Palm Sunday is a moment of joy, although we may not understand what it all really means much better than did those who followed Jesus into Jerusalem. Maundy Thursday offers final lessons, a betrayal, and the gift of a meal that helps us give thanks as we remember and celebrate the amazing love God has for us and Jesus' demonstration of that love. With the stripping of the sanctuary at the end of Maundy Thursday worship, we watch in horror as Jesus and his disciples are swallowed up in the anguish of Jesus' trial and crucifixion. As a community of faith, on Good Friday we join the Cross Walk, journeying among our neighboring churches and prayerfully reflecting on the full weight of our sins pressing down on Jesus as he hung on a cross until he died.

But then comes Easter! The women who went to the tomb early that morning were told by the angel, "Do not be afraid" – that phrase that always means something important has happened. Of course, they were afraid anyhow, as well as confused, but also hopeful in spite of themselves. As they were rushing to tell the disciples what they had seen and heard, Jesus appeared! Never mind trying to rationally explain it; the most important events and emotions in life depend on faith and belief. The women believed, and so do we!

After a long, cold winter, we have finally arrived at the greatest news imaginable. United with Jesus in baptism, his resurrection is our resurrection; his glory is our glory. In Jesus, we believe with absolute confidence and faith that we will live again – death has no power over us. We move into the new season of spring and into the blessing of life in the company of our risen Lord, certain that Jesus is walking with us every step of the way, now and forevermore. Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!

Payment for the ingredients that are packaged is covered by the \$30 per volunteer donations collected at the time of the packaging event. Since we had six youth members take part in the packing, those donations allowed them to pack without having to donate money as well as time.

### **Budget and Finance Corner**

Pledges for the month of February were \$10,552. This was \$1,352 below below budget. Total expenses were \$430 under budget. Year to date expenses are \$807 under budget.

Administrative/Office expenses were above budget due to the purchase of bulletin covers that will last for several months. Building and Grounds expenses were over budget due to higher utilities (gas) costs. Personnel expenses were under budget due to the lower than budgeted professional expenses, such as mileage and study allowance.

# Shut off the Lights and Lock the Door

If you are at a meeting or activity at the church and are likely the last person in the church, please check to be certain that is true. If so, you need to double check to make sure all the lights are off in the building and that all doors are locked. The doors to be locked are the front, kitchen and elevator.

We certainly don't want the church unlocked or several lights left on unnecessarily overnight or for a period of time during the day.

The session asked our committee to determine what information would be appropriate to have on the website especially in regard to the possibility of identity theft. We met with Marlys Grimm to help us determine if some information should be changed or removed. After lengthy discussion the following decisions were made: BIRTHDAYS-If the month and day are given but no year, identity theft is not considered to be a threat. We recommended continuing to list birthdays (month and day only), unless a member requests we stop listing theirs. MANUAL OF OPERATIONS-We feel the threat of identity theft or other ramifications are fairly low but since there might be some possibility of problems and we are not convinced of the value of having it on the website, Marlys has placed it on inactive status (cannot be accessed at this time, but could easily be returned to the website). CORPORATE ARTICLES-Placed on inactive status as per same reasoning as Manual of Operations. The main purpose for its placement on the website originally was to make it available for study before the upcoming vote for approval, which has occurred. MEMBER DIRECTORY-Has been placed on inactive status. PRAYER REQUESTS-When Marlys receives requests for prayers she will find out whether or not the individual or family wants it posted on the website.

At this time, we are planning to start updating the member directory this month. We plan to call everyone listed on the Messenger list to determine what information pertaining to you and your family you want represented in the new directory and if you want a new photo. Please start thinking now about what you would like us to put in the directory. There will also be a few other questions pertaining to church activities, rides to church, deacon visits, and improving our church life together.

Wilma Manning has recently resigned from the Greeting Ministry. Valerie Barney and son Cody have agreed to take her place. We very much appreciate Wilma's years of faithful service and are thankful to have Valerie and Cody join us in this effective and fun ministry.
