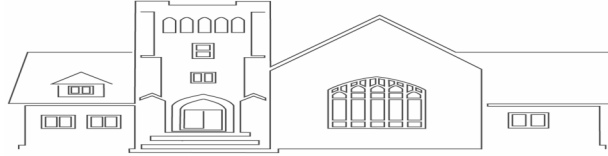

## Meghan's Musings

### Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus

It's that time of year again. That time of (usually harmless and unspoken) tension and disappointment between pastors such as myself who insist on holding Christmas at bay and really having Advent instead of jumping on the Christmas music bandwagon with the rest of our culture before the night of December 24. We really do have good, sound reasons for this. Reasons that, if memory serves me, I offered in my December newsletter article last year.

As I sit to write this year's article, my heart is pained and heavy from the weight and the sorrow of a violent and broken world. The longing and waiting for the Messiah seems perhaps even more acute this year than ever before (though I never would have thought that possible) and so I offer the words of "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus" here. I invite you to read them slowly, intentionally as an act of devotion and see if they don't speak to you as well.

Come, Thou long expected Jesus,  
Born to set Thy people free;  
From our fears and sins release us;  
Let us find our rest in Thee.

Israel's strength and consolation,  
Hope of all the earth Thou art;  
Dear desire of every nation,

## ADVENT LABYRINTH

### A Heart's Preparation for Christmas

The season of Advent is upon us . . . the season of preparation for Emanuel—God with us—Jesus's birth. First Presbyterian has many ways in which to prepare for Jesus's birth this year; daily readings from our Advent Book "Angels Among Us" and participating in the Advent Art Mosaic "Be Not Afraid" are just two opportunities. Building on those themes, we will have a labyrinth back in fellowship hall, after a few years hiatus.

Please set aside some time the week of December 13-20 to spend some private time and/or time with a group preparing *your heart* to receive the joy of Christmas. Sara Hopkins will be leading two labyrinth sessions and is willing to lead more. Watch the church bulletin, weekly email and church web site for specific dates and times.





Forms will be in the bulletin where you can order a poinsettia to be used to decorate our church chancel area. The cost this year will be \$9.50.

Your form and money can be put in the collection plate on Sunday morning or left at the church office. Place your order by Wednesday to have the plant delivered for the following Sunday service.

Following our service on December 29, you may choose to take your flower home, or leave it to decorate our church during January.

## Worship and Music

Discussion was held on previous services and also about the Advent booklets, which were handed out November 29, plus what our committee's part would be at the Thanksgiving feast on November 22.

Linda Kirchhoff and Sharon Black will be in charge of decorating the church for Advent and Christmas. Help may be solicited from one of the men's groups. Kim DeGraff will be getting volunteers to do the reading and lighting of the candles each week.

The Christmas pageant will be December 20, following the same format as in the past. We will finalize the details of the Christmas Eve service at our next meeting, but it will be Lessons and Carols.

Sandy Simbro indicated that the organ will be tuned by a Quimby representative and also the piano in the sanctuary and fellowship hall will be tuned.

Starting with communion at the Thanksgiving feast, gluten free bread will be offered as an option.

## Emergency Closure of the Church

With the arrival of winter weather, we have reviewed and updated our policies at First Presbyterian. In the event of severe weather, any changes to scheduled activities at the church will be communicated to KCOB Radio. They have assured us such information will be sent out over all 3 of their stations (1280 AM, 95.9 FM and KRTI 106.7 FM which covers Grinnell, Marshalltown, parts of Des Moines, etc.) In addition we have established an account with KCCI Television and WHO Radio. When severe weather occurs, check these sources. If First Presbyterian is not mentioned on any of these, then there is no change in our plans. However, if you have any doubts, please err on the side of caution and be safe!

## Budget and Finance Corner

Pledges for the month of October were \$14,676. This was \$2,858 above the amount we had budgeted. Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$630 for the month, which was \$106 below budget. In total for the month, expenses were \$1,689 over budget. Year-to-date pledges are \$6,730 over budget and year-to-date expenses are \$6,113 above budget.

The most activity was for Missions. The El Salvador Mission fund received donations of \$244. The International Mission fund paid expenses related to the El Salvador anniversary celebration. These were for food expenses and to pay Rev. Calhoun for pulpit supply and half of his travel expenses.

We received \$96.50 in October for the Rural Harvest offering. This will be sent to Presbytery in November.

### Local:

#### *Mission Coalition:*

Annual pie sale at McCann Craft Sale on October 24 netted \$865. Donations of \$425.00 each were sent to IMPACT Community Action Partnership and Salvation Army.

Annual Crop Hunger Walk on October 4 brought in \$4,378 county-wide. There were only 18 walkers this year. 2016 Crop Walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 2.

The Mission Coalition day to ring Salvation Army bells is Saturday, December 5. First Presbyterian is scheduled for 2-4 p.m. at Hy-Vee and 5:30-8 p.m. at Theisens. Half hour time slots are available and there is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board in fellowship hall. Those who want to ring longer than ½ hour can sign up as many times as they want.

First Presbyterian has been assigned Progress Industries again for spreading good cheer (presents) to clients. Marilyn McCallister is working with Melissa Butler at Progress Industries for client names and wish lists along with timing for gift collection and delivery. *Salvation Army Angel Tree:* We will again have a tree set up in the narthex with angel names from the Salvation Army. ## Presbyterian Meeting Report

Report on Des Moines Presbytery Meeting  
November 10, 2015

Heartland Presbyterian Church, Clive (FYI- FPC helped charter this church)

Mini Worship Services were held throughout the day, providing a break to business. Selected items of interest :

**\*Stated Clerk Report**

Our Session records were approved without exception. A proposed Manual of Operations will be sent to Leadership Council to make recommendations.

**\* Leadership Council Report**

Among other items scheduled is a retirement reception for Phil Barrett on Nov. 20. Broke into groups to express concerns regarding Presbytery.

**\* Church Professional Task Force**

The pastoral compensation minimums for our Presbytery for 2016 are: Effective salary: \$44,917. Pension dues-36.5% w/ family; 35% member only.

**\* Congregational Transition Task Force**

There have been several changes in pastorates. New pastors are at Cottage Grove, Sigourney (temporary supply), Oskaloosa (temporary supply), Atlantic (temporary supply).

Soon to be Ruling Elder Ekram Kachu of Cottage Grove will become organizing pastor of the first Arabic Presbyterian Church. Dissolutions of pastoral calls were in Winterset and Atlantic.

**\*Congregational Health Task Force Report**

There will be a task force assigned to assist the Arabic Worshipping Community in Des Moines.

**\*Nominating Committee Report** (Gary Parsons is a member)

Don Freeman, pastor at Newton United Presbyterian, was elected as a General Assembly Alternative. Cheryl Ritter is a new member of the Budget & Finance Committee 2017. David Hamilton of Des Moines Covenant church was elected as the temporary (1 yr.) stated clerk of Presbytery. David was the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of the Inland Northwest from 2001 – 2009 in Idaho. He left when he moved back to Iowa in 2010.

**\*Cottage Grove Mission Center.** In the Stated Clerk's Report, it was mentioned that Guide One Insurance will cancel insurance as of Dec. 12 on this facility due to poor condition of parts of the building. The 2016 plan for Cottage Grove is to keep the status quo for the next year while Presbytery determines its future and priorities as relating to center. Expenses for remodeling far exceeded expectations while projection of rental fees fell short.

**\*Older Adult Ministry.**

All 29 people who were nominated as Faithful Through the Years applicants were honored.

**\*New Sharon Administrative Commission Report- Mickey Van Baale, Moderator**

Only 3 members of the church are left. They let their insurance lapse, but are covered for liability through the Presbytery policy. The building has been deemed a hazard by the city. The exemption for property taxes has been revoked. The chimney had to be taken down and capped and charged against property taxes. The committee continues to work on resolution to situation.

**\*Compassion, Peace and Justice Report- Meghan Davis, Moderator**

-The Just Neighbor Award was given to Morris and Betty Dyer for the breadth of their service. (21 churches are now exclusively serving Don Justo coffee)  
 -Katherine Pater will be itinerating in Presbytery Nov. 13-21.  
 -The Rural Partnership Offering will be returned to its original name- Harvest Offering - with half of the funds to be used in rural Iowa and half internationally with emphasis on women in agriculture.  
 -An overture has been made to General Assembly by a presbytery regarding Fossil Fuel Divestment. The committee would urge the Des Moines Presbytery to consider concurring.

**\*Most of the day had to do with financial and personnel matters.** ((Budget Chair- Kirsten Kleper TE of Grinnell; Personnel Chair Tom Conrey) The audit of Presbytery recommended the hiring of an accountant. Betty Dyer has been keeping most of the books and is not certified to do so. Projected income for Presbytery will be a loss of at least \$25,000. The Budget Committee began by requesting that funds designated for assistance to small churches be undesignated and used for general funds. Per capita payments will remain at \$40. The Budget Committee then asked that the positions of Sudanese Ministry, Hunger Action Enabler and Communications Coordinator be eliminated, saving more than \$20,000 and allowing hiring of an accountant. After review of the newly published Des Moines Manual of Operations, it was discovered that people in positions to be eliminated needed 6 months written notice, hence 6 months salary. After much discussion (hours), a budget was finally passed in which the proposed salary for the new executive presbyter (proposed at  $\frac{3}{4}$  time) be reduced to  $\frac{2}{3}$  time and that New Covenant Funds be reduced by 7%, thus allowing the position of Hunger Action Enabler to be rescued, but be cut to  $\frac{2}{3}$  time.

The retiring moderator, Rev. Sharmaine Chambers King, Teaching Elder, handed over the gavel to Maurice Dyer, Ruling Elder, as the new moderator. (TE and RE rotate in this position)

Phil Barrett gave his final remarks as Executive Presbyter, thanking everyone for their service.

The meeting ended with communion by intinction (using gluten free bread), with participants standing in a large circle and singing.

## 2015 Advent Art Project – “Be Not Afraid”

In preparation for Advent, we are going to start a new all-church, inter-generational art project similar to the one we completed two years ago for Lent.

This time, we will have a canvas divided into 9 squares (or rectangles, depending on the canvas). Each square will represent an area of worry or anxiety in our lives, such as work, finances, health, family, hunger, world peace, our community, global warming or other nature-related worry, etc. You will be encouraged to participate by using magazine clippings from our supply, or some you bring from home, and applying them to those areas that are of particular interest to you. This is intended to be a prayerful and thoughtful experience that helps relieve some of the worry you may have about these issues as we worship through Advent and look forward to the birth of our Lord.

While the squares are being completed, the youth of the church will be creating small, white paper sculptures of wings (angels/ Faith), butterflies (Hope), doves or birds (Love) and cranes (Peace). These simple, white sculptures will be centered over a completed collage square to add a 3-dimensional aspect to the piece and represent that our worries are temporary and may be faced with Faith and Hope – “Be Not Afraid”!



As with the previous project, an easel will be set up in the Fellowship Hall with the prepared canvas, magazines and clippings, acrylic medium and brushes. This project requires no artistic talent, skill, hand strength, or the ability to draw a straight line. Anyone may participate!

If you have questions about the project, please contact Cathy Rickers. We hope to have the canvas completed before the end of Advent, so please pitch in and participate.
