#### **Bread Ministry...Help Needed**

The Bread Ministry falls under the umbrella of the Mission Committee and is a very effective ministry that is done behind the scenes. Members are in teams: the baker, who furnishes the bread and the taker, who delivers the bread.

Bread bakers bring to the parlor of the church either a loaf of homemade bread, some sort of quick bread or muffins. These are left in the kitchenette prior to worship.

The takers see if there are any guests at church that the bread can be given to. If not, they choose the recipient, be it someone with a special birthday, a guest minister or perhaps someone doing a solo or special number for the choir. The bread is placed in a gift bag, found in the kitchenette, along with the latest copy of the Messenger and a pamphlet about being Presbyterian. There is also a notebook where the recipient's name and pertinent information is recorded. All deliveries are done at church - none are delivered to a person's home.

At the present time we have had a team resign from this ministry and are looking for a new one as well as some substitutes. If you feel this is something you would like to do for our church, we would love to have you join our ministry.

#### **Reports:**

Fall Rural Harvest offering – According to the financial report, \$75 was given for the Rural Harvest offering this year.

Muñoces/Companeros/El Salvador – Marilyn reported that the steering group had met and made plans for delivering the "farewell" letter to Muñoces. A copy of the letter has been available to the congregation for signatures. Subsequently, Warren and Linda Erickson and Kimberly Schnell met with Jose and Karim Carballo in Pella to discuss a translation of the letter and possible translators and drivers while in El Salvador. The Carballos will translate the letter and assist with lining up the assistance needed in El Salvador.

Pal Craftaid sale – Pal Craftaid items have been for sale in Fellowship Hall during Advent. The remaining items will be for sale on the shelving next to the coffee in fellowship hall. These are the items that help people in Palestine.

Mission Coalition – The bells were rung for the Salvation Army on December 3 and participants noted the pleasure of ringing inside at True Value. All the Progress Industries gifts have been spoken for. Mission Coalition will not meet again until late January.

Giving opportunities – The Presbyterian Gift Catalog and the Christmas JOY offering were both promoted during Advent. We will report later on the amount received for the JOY offering.

Salvation Army – Barbara will check with the Salvation Army on what the needs currently are and this will be communicated to the congregation. We obtained 25 angels to buy gifts for. The gifts were taken back to the Salvation Army on December 16.

Days for Girls – Days for Girls International workshops continue. The sustainable feminine hygiene kit allows a girl to continue in school when she normally would have to spend a week each month confined to her home. At the last workshop, one complete kit was assembled. Our next workshop will be Thursday, January 26 from 9 am – 3 pm in fellowship hall with a delicious crock pot lunch provided. (Thank you, Linda Curtis-Stolper.) Our goal is to assemble more kits to be taken to Africa in February by our trainer, Kay Hertz of Des Moines. Donations of colorful underwear (girl's sizes 10-16 and women's sizes 5 & 6) are needed. All are welcome to participate in this great mission project.

2017 Mission Statement – Marilyn would like to review the committee description in January and, perhaps, plan a retreat to address changes.

Bulletin Boards in Fellowship Hall – Linda Erickson stated that she would be removing the El Salvador material on the southeast bulletin board before the end of the year. It has yet to be determined if this will still be used for Mission related items or if it will be used for other purposes. Our committee also has the bulletin board at the bottom of the stairs leading into Fellowship Hall.

2017 Work Week - The steering committee has not met to determine a location for the 2017 trip. It is hoped that if enough youth are interested a trip to a further away location may be possible.

## **Emergency Closure of the Church**

With the arrival of winter weather, we have reviewed and updated our policies at First Presbyterian. In the event of severe weather, any changes to scheduled activities at the church will be communicated to KCOB Radio. They have assured us such information will be sent out over all 3 of their stations (1280 AM, 95.9 FM and KRTI 106.7 FM which covers Grinnell, Marshalltown, parts of Des Moines, etc.) In addition we will contact KCCI, WOI and WHO television stations so the changes will scroll on their weather related messages. When severe an all church email will be sent. If First Presbyterian is not mentioned on any of these, then there is no change in our plans. However, if you have any doubts, please err on the side of caution and be safe!

#### At our December meeting we:

- Received reports on visits. Nancy Mott indicated that Jeanne Bridenstine has moved to a different room. Janet Shields reported that Eloise Krajnovich recently was moved to the nursing unit at Newton Village. Several indicated they have seen Linda Means, not necessarily on scheduled visits.
- Were informed by Meghan that she has been visiting Matt Illingworth. She added that she thought deacons, especially those known to Matt, should have informal visits with him, and it was agreed that this will be done.
- Learned from Shirley Stevens that she had sent out 19 cards during November.
- Were told that only a couple of addresses for college students had been received for sending care packages, which hasn't been done yet.
- Received a suggestion from Meghan that with heating season having arrived, we should consider making a donation to the IMPACT Community Action Partnership. Deacons voted to donate \$150 to IMPACT for energy bill assistance.
- Didn't make any other donations because a formal treasurer's report was not available.

## **Budget and Finance Corner**

Pledges for the month of November were \$9,997. This was \$523 below budget for the month. Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$790 for the month, which is \$54 above budget. In total for the month, expenses were \$562 below budget.

Year-to-date through November, pledges are \$3,217 over budget and expenses are \$1,385 below budget.

#### **Activity included:**

- \*The Memorial Fund received \$50.
- \*We received a \$3,850 distribution from the Foundation, representing earnings on the Foundation principal.
- \*Related to the front step project, \$1,200 was paid for architect fees and \$2,740 for concrete removal and sewer line replacement.
- \*The Funeral Luncheon Fund received a donation of \$250.
- \*The Mission-Disaster Relief-Local fund disbursed \$100 for the Lebanon/Syria disaster relief and \$200 for General PDA disaster relief.
- \*The Sundays at 4 fund received \$100 in donations.
