Pledges for the month of May were \$13,330. This was \$1,512 above budget for the month. Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge was \$225 for the month, which was \$481 below budget. In total for the month, expenses were \$270 over budget. This was due to having the piano tuned, costs for the graduation breakfast and gifts and the annual website hosting fee. Over \$400 was taken in to help cover the membership directory expense. Year-to-date pledges through May are almost exactly on budget. Expenses are \$3,572 over budget.
