

Meghan's Musings Thank you!!

Thank you for stepping up and responding so generously to our second stewardship drive to close our budget deficit for 2018!

As you know, we had an anonymous \$10,000 matching challenge. I'm happy to report that we met and surpassed the challenge with a total of \$20,336.00 (as of March 7) in increased pledging not including the challenge. Additionally, we had another anonymous donation from someone not wishing to increase their pledge but giving a one time \$10,000 donation specifically earmarked for the general fund. So, we have closed the deficit in this year's budget!

"All things of true value grow when given." I recently read those words in a journal I'm using (*Rituals for Transformation: 108 Day Journey to Your Sacred Life*). The writer continues:

"If you give someone your sandwich, you won't have a sandwich anymore. But the kindness you offered, there's more of that now than there was before.

"In the mind's world of duality, when something is given it's lost. But in reality, offerings of value amplify that value for both the giver and the receiver. By true value, we mean that which promotes greater alignment with or awareness of [God]—such as love, acceptance, peace, light, presence, truth, beauty, forgiveness, wisdom and kindness. In truth, such an act of giving is more like God sharing God with God than it is a transfer of value.

"If you want more of these qualities in your life, give them to others."

Sisters and Brothers, in so many ways you have multiplied the true value of your financial contributions to your church family, to the future and sustainability of the ministry of First Presbyterian Church of Newton, Iowa. In preparation for this annual collection to help the mission projects of Christian churches, the mission committee will be reminding you this Lenten season of the needs this program provides and your participation in serving. The basis for this season will be the 58th chapter of Isaiah. Each Sunday we will have a symbol of the week's emphasis, the verses that relate to the day, and some international food at coffee time. We hope these ideas will help you understand the OGH, its mission and emphases. ** Neighbors Helping Neighbors has committed to providing a "Laundry Night" on the second and fourth Monday nights of each month, providing all the supplies needed so those who may not have laundry facilities at home can come to the laundromat and do their laundry. Budget and Finance Corner

Operating Revenue and Expenses for the month:

- Pledges for the month of January were \$29,325. This was \$285 above budget for the month. As a reminder, this month's pledges include \$13,048 in 2018 prepaid pledges that were made in 2017.
- Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$1,200 for the month, which was \$800 above budget.

Other Income for the month:

- ♦ We recorded a \$4,632.52 change in our investment value during the month.
- ♦ We had \$445.04 in per capita donations.

Expenses for the month:

- ♦ Building & Grounds expense was \$196.89 above budget due to anticipated repairs/maintenance expenses, including snow removal and piano tuning.
- **♦ The International Mission fund paid \$476 for supplies related to the Days for Girls project.**
- ♦ The Undesignated Mission fund paid \$55.32 in ramp building supplies.

In total for the month, expenses were \$92 above budget.
