Of course, today's the day I decided to wear never-before-worn dress shoes that are not exactly made for walking. At 6:59 I got a text from Doug Cutts, "Are you here at the church?" I was expected to give the welcome at the beginning of the concert... I got there just in time to go straight to the mic, give the welcome and sit down.

And then... the concert. Oh. my. goodness. The concert was wonderful. As always. What a blessing it is to have this beautiful tradition of the Newton High School and Central College choirs joining with ours each year. Introducing Our New Parish Associate: CRE Linda Curtis-Stolper

Of course, that's a bit of a joke, to be introducing longtime member Linda Curtis-Stolper to you. But...

In the Presbyterian Church (USA) once someone is ordained as a minister, they can no longer be a member of a church, instead they are a member of the Presbytery. What then is their relationship with a local congregation? There is a title "Parish Associate" for those who are ordained as Minister of Word and Sacrament but not serving in a parish. Typically, a Parish Associate is either a retired pastor or someone serving in specialized ministry (such as a chaplain). The position of Parish Associate helps to clarify the role of the ordained but not formally serving pastor in the congregation where they attend. However, there is no such equivalent for Commissioned Ruling Elders, such as Linda Curtis-Stolper. So...

Over the course of the last year or so, Session, Linda Curtis-Stolper and I (Meghan) have been working on such an arrangement, both for Linda's sake (to help her in this unique position of being a CRE who also served as interim pastor in her home congregation) and for our sake—on more than one occasion we found ourselves in a tricky situation when Linda was filling the pulpit on a first Sunday but technically, as she was no longer "commissioned" to the FPCN, was not permitted to officiate over the Lord's Table.

At the February 2017 meeting of the Presbytery of Des Moines, Linda was commissioned to serve as CRE Parish Associate for our congregation and a couple weeks later we had a formal recognition in worship.

Here is what Linda's position entails:

- assisting with providing pastoral care as requested by the Teaching Elder (Meghan Davis), including visits to homes, hospitals, nursing facilities, and other settings
- serving as primary pulpit supply worship leader/preacher in the absence of the Teaching Elder
- officiating at the Lord's Table to serve Holy Communion if the Teaching Elder is unavailable for a worship service when Communion would normally be scheduled
- when circumstances require or upon consideration of a family request, assisting in organizing and conducting funerals and other worship services at the discretion of and invitation by the Teaching Elder in accordance with the Book of Order (W-1.4005 and W-4.10003)
- other duties as assigned by the Teaching Elder

Responsibilities to be fulfilled by First Presbyterian Church will include:

- making names and contact information available for congregational members and friends to be contacted or visited
- providing advance notice of dates when pastoral duties or pulpit supply services will be needed due to absence of the Teaching Elder
- making services of the Administrative Associate and other church staff available for preparation of worship service materials
- paying the Parish Associate for each worship service conducted and mileage for travel to pastoral visits outside of Newton city limits

I hope that the church family will be as excited about the opportunity to serve with Linda in this capacity as I am. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask me.

Budget and Finance Corner

Pledges for the month of January were \$10,433. This was \$211 below budget for the month.

Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$345 for the month.

During the month the following income was collected:

- Christian Nurture income of \$576 collected at the dinner/school play event and will be used for youth group activities.
- Church Life income included \$287, collected at the Potato Bar.
- Investment income was \$4,609 for the first quarter of 2017, which we had budgeted.
- Other income of \$124 was collected for Lenten breakfast donations.
- Worship and Music received \$180 in March for Easter lilies and a \$25 donation for music.
- Per Capita donations of \$633, bringing our total to \$3,716, which is \$590 below budget.

In total for the month, expenses were \$601 under budget.

Year-to-date through March:

- Pledges are \$55,744 over budget
- Other Regular Giving is \$1,192 over budget.
- Expenses are \$191 over budget.

Program Expenses for February:

- Memorial fund received \$1,275 in contributions.
- The Funeral luncheon fund received a net of \$136.
- Designated Mission Account received \$60 for One Great Hour offering.
- International Mission Account received \$350 for "Days for Girls" and \$8 for Pal Craft.
