Message from Pastor John

My Dear Family of Faith,

Easter is an overwhelmingly powerful season which is the foundation of our Christian faith. The Resurrection of Jesus becomes a chief reason for our uniting together in mission, in worship, and in witness to Him Who is the Resurrection and the Life.

What does this relationship mean to you and me? What makes the foundation of our faith so powerful that we retell it every year at this time? I would have everyone read I Corinthians 15. It is Paul's most definitive statement about the power of the Resurrection. We cannot hide from the impact that such has in each of us personally and as a church. Something propels the church to want to tell about this event. So, what would you tell someone about the Resurrection of Jesus?

I had a professor of New Testament in Seminary who knew the power of the Resurrection from his personal experience. He and his wife had a young boy, who died prematurely. It was a grief that no parent would wish on anyone. But, in the process of dealing directly with their grief, this family found the greater source of strength and faith that ministered to them. They experienced the Resurrection through memory, through stories of their young boy, and through the mutual tears, hugs, encouragement, and prayerful sobs that all could share without any shame. But, more so, this young family reached out in the name of Him Who is the Resurrection and the Life and found a strength and belief that the Resurrection is not some fairy tale or some psychological comfort, but a real experience that cannot be denied. They found that power could affirm life beyond life and joy in the midst of pain and grief. In fact, the professor wrote a book – a commentary on the gospel of Matthew and in the opening dedication page, dedicated the commentary to his young son, who taught him and his wife the true power of the Resurrection of Jesus.

What is out there in life that could teach us the Resurrection Power of Jesus? Read 1 Corinthians 15 and see how Paul defines and expresses the Resurrection for you. It is a power that unleashed the living from the dead – not zombie-like, but for eternity in which all who claim the victory of Jesus over sin and death, will know the power of the Resurrection first hand.

I pray that this day and every day be a reminder of the Resurrection of Jesus on which we rely every day in all situations of life. It will minister to each of us in those times when we are in grief or some despair. As the Prayer of St. Francis would conclude, "For it is in dying that we are born to eternal life!"

As of the end of February, pledges for the month were \$9,804, which is \$1,946 below budget for the month. Because pledges were significantly higher than budget in January, we are still ahead of our budget expectation on a year-to-date basis.

The Funeral Meals fund received donations from the Skokan and Tiedje families.


Prayers for:



Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!

Every time I think of you I pray for you, and I think of you quite often! It fills my heart with such joy when Isaac goes home to Newton and to you. You care for him in such profound ways you may not even realize. And I know you have invested in countless kids and teenagers over the years. What a blessing.

Yes I have good news. I am the transitional pastor at Wallingford Presbyterian Church, a small neighborhood family church in the neighborhood where I went to high school. My prayer for you always is for healing and hope. I am excited for your PNC and pray for them too. God's timing is trustworthy and He has already gone ahead getting someone ready. Again, thank you for 10 amazing, hard, good years together.

Scholarship Students from Muñoces!

The Mission Committee and the El Salvador interest group are pleased to announce that our church is sponsoring five students from Muñoces in their efforts to attend high school this school year. For a number of years, we have been designating some of the funds raised for El Salvador to go for scholarships and had accumulated \$1000 in the scholarship fund but have never been asked to support a student. Last year we discovered the problem. The school in Muñoces only goes through the sixth grade and then a student must walk to El Tablón to continue on to "middle school". If a student completes school in El Tablón and wants to continue on to high school they must find a way to get to or live in Berlin...the closest high school. Because all Muñoces students complete middle school in El Tablón, Heartland Presbyterian Church... which is the partner church with El Tablón...has been funding all the scholarships. They didn't check to see if the student was walking over from Muñoces. A scholarship is \$100, which is paid in two installments...one before the first semester and one after they present their report cards to the Pastoral team at the beginning of the second semester. So now we have five Muñoces youngsters who are attending high school and have requested and received scholarships. We are happy to know that five students are continuing their education...the only hope of breaking out of the cycle of poverty in their community. The following is some information received from Katherine Pater, the mission co-worker, about education in El Salvador and about the scholarship program of the pastoral team. Each month we will introduce you to one of the five students from Muñoces.

Muñoces Scholarship Students First Presbyterian Newton

Greetings, First Presbyterian!

School began here in Berlín on the 21st of January. You can tell that school is underway when you walk through the streets of the city —there are students walking to and from school, many dressed in their school uniforms, on every street. On January 10th, there was a meeting at the Pastoral House for all the students who are receiving scholarships this year. Some receive these scholarships through their partner churches—from people like you. Some scholarships come from the 'general education' funds we have here at the Pastoral House. That fund is supported by donations from a variety of people. At this meeting we talk about the roles and responsibilities of all of us. The student's job is to study well and take full advantage of this financial gift and this opportunity to be in school. Now is the time to study and learn. Studying comes before watching television and playing soccer. The students are also expected to bring us a copy of their grades every few months and write a note to those who are helping them. The parent's job is to encourage and motivate their children to study, do their homework, and apply themselves. The Pastoral House's job — other than the obvious financial support — is to encourage, provide moral support, open our doors when the students need assistance with research or typing (we have a Spanish set of encyclopedias as well as two typewriters), and share their stories with those who are supporting their education with the hope for their continued support. You are helping them to realize their dreams, better their future, and learn the skills they need to help their community thrive... And they are grateful for your faith in them.

Meet Melvin Edgardo Mejia

Melvin is the son of Jose Gilberto Mejia and Rosa del Carmen Quintanilla who live and farm in Muñoces. He has 5 brothers and sisters and was 11 years old and in the 4th grade when we first met him and his family in 2007. He attends the Saturday intensive study school in Alegria so that he can work in the fields to help support the family during the week. His picture and solicitation follow.

The reason for Presenting this letter to you is whether you could help me because I want to earn a baccalaureate because I am going to distance study on Saturdays.
