Meghan's Musings

As I sit down to write my April "Musings" it is not yet Palm Sunday and yet, by the time the newsletter is distributed, it will be Holy Week. It occurs to me that Lent and Holy Week are a lot like lowa late winter and early spring: we go through the trial and wilderness of winter/Lent; we might have some lovely warm weather (remember that 82 degree Monday a few weeks back?), not unlike the joy and celebration of Palm Sunday; then it's back to some unpleasantness: cold temperatures in Iowa, betrayal and crucifixion for Jesus; only to all be redeemed through new life and Resurrection of Christ and spring that's here to stay (or so I'm told... though sometimes I have my doubts). And yet, spring will come. And Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Amen! To get us through Holy Week to Easter, I offer this by Ann Weems, one of my favorite poets:

HOLY WEEK

Holy is the week... Holy, consecrated, belonging to God... We move from hosannas to horror with the predictable ease of those who know not what they do. Our hosannas sung, our palms waved, let us go with passion into this week. It is a time to curse fig trees that do not yield fruit. It is a time to cleanse our temples of any blasphemy. It is a time to greet Jesus as the Lord's Anointed One. to lavishly break our alabaster and pour perfume out for him without counting the cost. It is a time for preparation... The time to give thanks and break bread is upon us. The time to give thanks and drink of the cup is imminent. Eat, drink, remember: On this night of nights, each one must ask, as we dip our bread in the wine. "Is it I?" And on that darkest of days, each of us must stand beneath the tree and watch the dying if we are to be there when the stone is rolled away. The only road to Easter morning

is through the unrelenting shadows of that Friday. Only then will the alleluias be sung; only then will the dancing begin.

Virginia Bennett and Warren Erickson will share choir director duties through May.

Bill Calhoun, our former pastor, has written a book, *Notes in the Margin*, which may be purchased through Tattered Covers Book Store in Denver.

The lamb sculpture, given by Bill and Nancy Shields in memory of their son, has been placed in the sanctuary and will remain throughout the Easter season.

Plans were formulated for Holy Week. Eco-palms will be used on Palm Sunday and Meghan will give the children's sermon. There will be a traditional Maundy Thursday service with communion by intinction. The Cross Walk will be held on Good Friday. Communion will be served on Easter Sunday.

Meghan mentioned that in her previous church, she and 3 other pastors held a Lenten study in the evening once a week during Lent, rotating churches and leaders. An event of this nature may be tried in the future.

Meghan will be on vacation for 2 Sundays from April 22nd through May 4th. George Wilkening will preach on April 26th, and Linda Curtis-Stolper will provide the sermon and lead the communion service on May 3rd.



SPECIAL PROJECT THE HISTORY OF FIRST PRESBYTERIAN

There is a very large amount of history and miscellaneous records of our church stored in the building, in member's homes, etc. It is important enough to preserve our history that PC(USA) provides guidance and facilities to support that work. The Session is asking for people to step forward - form a small committee - to identify, sort and preserve our records. This will be a big, fascinating, and very important job, so if it's something you would like to help with, please contact Meghan Davis or Dave Boyd to find out more of what will be involved.

Buildings and Grounds

The committee approved hiring Jack Topp to complete Phase I of a design for the front steps, per the rate shown on his estimate: \$600 plus up to \$150 in costs. The new design would have a landing outside the front door at the same level as the door, to eliminate the step up to go into the church. Jack was in attendance at our meeting. We also approved having him digitize the paper copy of the old church blueprints, which would cost around \$40. There will likely need to be a more detailed Phase 2 design of the steps before we can bid out the construction part of the project.

Deanna and Harold Manley replaced 44 CFL bulbs in the Sanctuary chandeliers and down lights in the chandeliers, spot lights on the stage and sconce lights. They purchased bulbs on-line due to uniqueness and no local source. They have assessed the Exit signs downstairs and replaced bulbs, but the battery back-up does not work and is not repairable, so the B&G decided to price replacement fixtures. The Manleys purchased a contractor pack of 34 watt T12 tubes for the downstairs ceiling fixtures since the building uses that type of lighting in many places. They will replace burned our tubes as needed. They also discovered there are two fixtures with bad ballasts that will need to be replaced, so those will be ordered as well.

Budget and Finance Corner

Pledges for the month of February were \$12,715. This was \$897 above budget for the month. Other regular giving, which represents donations from people who tithe but do not pledge, was \$390 for the month.

Year-to-date pledges through February are \$1,230 above budget. Year-to-date expenses are \$452 below budget.

The Deacons received donations of \$66 and made a \$150 donation to the El Salvador Mission Fund. In addition to the donation from the Deacons, the El Salvador fund also received another \$855 in donations and sold \$10 in crafts. They made a \$2,000 undesignated gift to El Salvador and paid \$573 in trip-related expenses.

Scholarship students from Muñoces



Lock the doors: Check and double check! By Rev. Meghan

We've recently had some incidents when various doors to the church were found unlocked when they should have been locked. Please note: we have a relatively new knob/lock on the front door. Unlike the previous system which would stay locked when opened, the new knob unlocks when opened from the inside, even if it was locked before it was opened. So please make sure it's locked whenever it needs to be locked.

Also, please make sure the kitchen door is shut all the way. (Sometimes it doesn't shut all the way so even though the knob is locked, the door can be opened.)

Basically, if the doors should be locked, just remember to double check doors when you're leaving the building.
