Meghan's Musings

Last Easter I "joked" about it being the first Easter of the COVID-19 Pandemic. I thought it was a joke. At that point we were almost exactly a month into the pandemic and already it felt like a year had passed. Little did we know how we'd feel when an *actual* year had passed. Little did I know that my "joke" wasn't a joke and that the first Easter of the pandemic wouldn't be the last.

But the good news is, we are so close to being out of this! So many of us have been vaccinated—thanks be to God! And last I checked, COVID numbers in Newton and Jasper County were way down (and I hope they stay there!) We're slowly getting back to something resembling normal with our first "in-person" worship service in a year on March 14. We'll be back in the sanctuary for Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday. We'll have a traditional Easter service with communion pre-recorded and online only but we'll also have a short sunrise service on the front lawn—bring your own chair—weather permitting (and given as much as I'm looking forward to worshiping with you in-person on Easter, the weather will have to be really, REALLY terrible for me to surrender and call it off! Heaven forbid!)

So here's what we have planned for Holy Week:

Palm Sunday (March 28)—in person worship (face masks and social distancing required). We still won't be singing though so we'll have to sing our "Hosannas" on our own at home. Like last year, palms will be spread on the front walkway Sunday morning so if you're planning to worship online, you can still come pick up a palm either prior to or later in the day. This service will also be pre-recorded and available online.

Maundy Thursday (April 1)-- in person worship (face masks and social distancing required). We will be providing pre-packaged individual communion elements (a tiny cup of juice and tiny wafer) but you are welcome to bring your own juice/bread if you prefer (i.e. you don't want to hassle with trying to open the package or if you have any other concerns). This service will NOT be pre-recorded but will be available via ZOOM using the log-in information used for Sunday fellowship, technology permitting.

Good Friday (April 2)—Something a little different this year:

First Presbyterian Church of Palo Alto will be hosting a Traditional Midday Good Friday Service and welcoming in the current Co-Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA), Gregory Bentley, as well as seven former Moderators and Vice-Moderators. This is a unique experience to meet and hear the voices of leaders from our church as each takes one of the seven last words of Christ.

This will be held on Zoom only. No registration required. 1 pm Central Time.

An update on the Mauck family from Linda Anderson. They are the adoptive family of Anderson's granddaughter, Carly. Things are about the same. Ron, the husband/dad, will be having surgery on April 26 for probable kidney cancer. Geri, the wife/mom, could use prayers for sleep/

rest as she takes care of herself, Carly, and the rest of her family's needs

Bret Doerring let us know that his dad, Bob, has been under hospice care since January. Bret had been staying at night so his mom, Marva, could get some relief and rest. The plan is to move Bob to Newton Village, as soon as a room becomes available. Monday, March 15, was not a good day for Bob, as he was very confused and needed more help than usual. The hospice personnel suggested finding somewhere else Bob could be moved to as a bridge until a room becomes available at Newton Village. So, he is at a Hospice House in Johnston. Bret emphasized that death is not eminent, though Bob is not doing as well as he was. Rather this is a place for him to be until a room becomes available here in Newton.

Peter Van Elswyk, who had a recent CT scan that revealed nodules in his lungs that appear to be cancerous. He had a biopsy done on Tuesday, March 23. Peter said that went fine, but it will be 3-5 days before he gets the results. Peter requests that the church family keep him in thoughts & prayers.

Kay Parsons, who will have a cornea transplant on March 31.

Daxton Dorr, 3-year old son of Emily and James and grandson of Sandy and Kris Simbro. Daxton broke his leg in 2 places, both below the knee and will have a cast from his hip to his ankle.

Our First "In-Person" Worship in a Year




Thirty-six (36) people attended our first time of being able to worship in person since the start of the pandemic a year ago. 
Membership Spotlight ---
