Meghan's Musings

The Camino Continues

Dear Church Family and Friends,

It's so good to be back after my sabbatical. Thank you all for this once in a lifetime opportunity! Special thanks to Linda Curtis-Stolper for filling the pulpit and for everyone who stepped up to help hold down the fort.

As you might imagine, I'm still in "re-entry" and the process of learning from my Camino, as well as my time in Scotland and other sabbatical time will continue indefinitely. I appreciate Alexander John Shaia's take in his book Returning from Camino. He encourages the pilgrim to think of Santiago de Compostela not as the "destination" but as the "turnaround place;" the Camino is not from St. Jean de Pied de Port to Santiago de Compostela but from home back to home. Likewise, the lessons and growth from the Camino may not appear until weeks, months or even years after the return home.

With that in mind, here's a message Shaia recommends sharing with friends and family:

The Camino is neither a holiday nor a vacation. Though enjoyable, it is arduous work, and potentially a rite of passage that will change a pilgrim in significant ways. ... [a pilgrim] cannot know beforehand what the experience will be, what will be the impact, or how it might change him or her. No matter how well you think you know your [pilgrim], you cannot know how she or he will change, nor can you know their needs upon their return.

Further, a pilgrim upon homecoming will most likely experience a fair amount of bewilderment. They will need time back in their ordinary life before they are able to make sense of the Camino, its impact and meaning. To the pilgrim, the effects and changes are usually subtle. New thoughts and attitudes only become clear once a pilgrim is back in familiar surroundings and realize they are experiencing usual events quite differently.

Some returning pilgrims need a great deal of space, patience and time to explore who they are now. Others have an even higher need to talk as they verbally process the experience. Either response can bring up various feelings (anger, impatience, frustration, envy) in those closest to a pilgrim because of her or his need for distance or increased closeness while processing their experience.

Try to view the returning pilgrim's bewilderment and questioning as an invitation for your own reflection. What areas in your own life do you wish to change? Even though you were not engaged directly in the walking, know that through the returning pilgrim the Camino invites your growth as well. Be open to change—change in your relationship with the returning pilgrim, and your own growth.

I've added the bold formatting to the final paragraph because I wish to invite you to engage in our own self-reflection as Shaia suggests. What areas in our life do you wish to change? What growth are you prepared for in your own life?

Both my older sister and I went to Triennium, the national PC(USA) youth gathering held on the Purdue campus every three years. When my sister got back she talked practically non-stop for days telling us everything about it. When I got back, I told my parents "it was good." And not much more. (It really irritated my mom who would have much rather I shared all the details.) Triennium was no less a transformative experience for me than it was for my sister, indeed considering our life paths most likely it was more so for me than for her. Our manner of sharing (or lack thereof) was simply a reflection of our different ways of processing our experiences.

I promise I will share much more with you than "it was good." But I cannot promise a timeline or manner in which I will do so. It might come up in every sermon for the next few months. Or it might come up every now and then. Meanwhile, the Camino continues...

Days for Girls



Days for Girls final workshop for 2022 was Thursday, December 1^{st} . The first workshop in 2023 will be Thursday, January 26th, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. in fellowship hall, weather permitting.

At our October workshop we had two special guests share about the homeless population in Newton. We will continue to explore if the DfG sustainable feminine hygiene kits would be beneficial for Newton's homeless women.

A trip to our designated Collection Point in Liberty, Missouri was completed recently in response to a request for feminine hygiene kits for women and girls in Bolivia, South America. This delivery included the following hygiene kit components: 868 liners, 137 carry pouches, 60 drawstring bags and 133 small bars of soap. The Missouri Collection Point is housed in a warehouse where kit components are checked and packaged for distribution requests.

DfG International continues to provide sustainable feminine hygiene kits to women and girls all over the world and our DfG Newton IA Team will continue to provide kit components to support this very important endeavor.

At this point we still have 13 to place. We have varying plans on how to place the rest of them and should be completed within 1-2 weeks. As most of you are probably aware, they are costing the church \$12 per copy to print so we are suggesting members and attendees consider a donation of that amount (or more, if possible). We are coming up a little short of the needed amount. However, we do want all members and attendees have one so we encourage you to do what is comfortable for you. 528th Presbytery Meeting Report

528[⊪] Presbytery Meeting Report November 12, 2022 Westminster Presbyterian Church Des Moines, Iowa

This was a hybrid meeting with some members meeting in person and others joining in via Zoom.

Linda Curtis-Stolper and I attended in person. Rev. Meghan Davis-Brass was excused as she is on her Sabbatical.

Highlights of the meeting were:

• As a change to our normal procedures, we held our worship service all at one time, following the Call to order. CRE Linda Curtis-Stolper from our church offered the meditation entitled "Creative Teamwork." It was a very good sermon.

- Approval of May 17, 2022 Presbytery meeting.
- Approval of the report from the Commission on Ministry

• This involves the approval of new ministers, ministers retiring, and ministers and RE who are appointed as Moderators of Sessions or stated supply.

• The only action was the approval of the 2023 minimum effective salary of \$55,500. This is an increase of just under 5% from the current rate of \$52,920 for 2022. **This motion passed unanimously.**

• Received the reports from the Personnel Commission, the Presbytery Moderator, the New Worshiping Community Committee, the Camping and Youth Ministries, the three Executives, the Living Legacy Fund Committee, and the Property Committee.

• Approval of the Leadership Council Committee report.

• The manual of Operations was reviewed after updates had been made that were proposed earlier. Three more amendments were approved. **The revised Manual of Operations was approved.** Mickey Van Baale will be typing up the new manual, making all the necessary changes, formatting the manual, and adding the new amendments.

• Approved the following dates for the meetings in 2023: stated meetings on February 11, May 16, and November 11. April 27 will be a called evening zoom meeting for GA Amendments and in August there will be the All Iowa Gathering.

528th Presbytery Meeting Report Continued

• Approval of the Nominating Committee

• An audit was made of this committee as there were several instances where positions were not recorded properly. All committee members are recorded as they should be and with the approval of the slate of nominees today, most all committees are filled.

• Linda Curtis-Stolper was elected as Vice-Moderator for 2023, which means she will be the Moderator of the Presbytery for 2024.

• Larry Anderson was elected to begin his 3-year term on the Committee on the Promotion of Social Righteousness.

- Met Sara Sutter via Zoom. She is the new director of the Lakeshore Center at Okoboji.
- Budget and Finance Committee
 - Received the September 30, 2022, Financial Report
 - Approved the 2023 Budget

• Approved having the Synod of Lakes and Prairies do the accounting functions, starting January 1, 2023.

• The per capita rate for 2023 will be \$47.00.

• Received the reports of the Park Avenue, Des Moines First, and Greenfield First Administrative Commissions.

- These 3 churches are closing or have closed. The church buildings have been or will be sold and the contents will or have been disposed of.
- The Administrative Commissions for Des Moines First and Greenfield First were decommissioned.
- Celebrated the Installation of Linda Curtis-Stolper as the new Vice Moderator.


