Meghan's Musings Advent Challenge

I recently came across a weekend self- care "Countdown for Success Challenge." The idea is to do on both days of the weekend:

- 10 pages or minutes of reading
- 9 thousand steps a day
- 8 hours of sleep
- 7 glasses of water
- 6 minutes of meditation
- 5 servings of fruit
- 4 breaks
- 3 healthy meals
- 2 hours of no phone
- 1 workout session

I saw this challenge and my response was, "I love it! I'm in!" But... of course the weekend got busy the challenge got moved to the back burner and, admittedly, any of those things I did "hit" were coincidental, not because I was trying to complete the challenge.

If you're like me, Advent can unfold much the same. I start each Advent determined to have a truly sacred time of prayerful waiting and preparation rather than the frenzied chaos that the holidays can so easily entail. I have two or three beloved Advent Devotionals that I like to return to every year, and of course there's our annual devotional. I begin each Advent determined to read all of these devotionals daily but somewhere between the first Sunday of Advent and December 24, I fall off the wagon.

This Advent I invite you to join me in a different "Countdown for Success Challenge":

- 10 minutes of reading per day (Advent devotional, scripture or other)
- 9 personal Christmas cards (telling the recipient why they are special to you)
- 8 make treats and deliver them to 8 people who aren't expecting them
- 7 breaks: an hour (or more) to rest or do something you WANT to do but probably wouldn't do because you don't have time and you think you SHOULD be doing something else
- 6 minutes of prayer and/or meditation per day
- 5 dollar donation to a cause you like but you don't usually support
- 4 worship services in Advent (Blue Christmas and Christmas Eve count!)
- 3 "pay it forwards" (for example: buy coffee for the person behind you in line, put money in someone else's expired parking meter, etc.)
- 2 (waking) hours of no phone per week
- 1 hour volunteering somewhere you've never volunteered before

For fun, I've created a "bingo" card. See how many Bingos you can get. Maybe you'll even get a "blackout"!

Whether you do all these things or just a few or none at all, my prayer for you is that your Advent will be a truly sacred time of anticipation and preparation for the coming of the Christ Child.

Offering of Letters Advocating for Child Nutrition

As a congregation designated by our denomination as a Hunger Action Congregation, First Presbyterian acted on this commitment on Reformation Sunday, October 27. We affirmed that the "least among us," those young children around the world at risk of stunting from chronic malnutrition, have the same claim to life and health as our own children here at home.

Twenty-nine letters were written during worship and nailed to the door as a statement of our dissatisfaction with the persistence of hunger and poverty alongside great wealth – echoing Martin Luther's protest against the abuses of the Church when he nailed the 95 Theses to the door in Wittenberg, Germany, in 1517.

These letters voiced support for House Resolution 189 and Senate Resolution 260, which further our nation's effort to impact global child malnutrition and which are supported by over 140 Republicans and Democrats in both houses, including Rep. Loebsack and Sen. Ernst. The letters were sent together to the intended representative, with cover letters from Rev. Meghan Davis.

The Mission Committee is grateful to the congregation for fulfilling this important task. But let's not limit our advocacy to this one act! Most of us had time to write to only one representative during the worship service. It is very simple to write a letter or email to the others, and we would encourage us all to continue speaking up on behalf of those who don't have a big lobby in Congress. We, collectively, are a lobby of citizens, and we do have influence when we speak clearly with a united voice.
