Meghan's Musings

What is your mission?

The following is adapted from a recent sermon. It is something that strikes me as extremely important so I wanted to make sure that those who weren't in worship that Sunday don't miss it and those who were there get the reminder...

What is your mission? That was the first question in my new "question a day 5 year journal". As the name suggests, every day of the year there's a new question to answer with space to answer for five years. So after five years have passed, if I've kept it up, I will have answered each question five times. I thought it sounded like a fun idea, and hoped it would inspire me to more frequent journaling. But when I opened it to the first page and saw "what is your mission?" I admit I was a bit taken aback. I wasn't expecting such hard questions. What was I getting myself into? Luckily, not all the questions are as deep as Jan 1 "What is your mission?" Some are pretty trivial: "name three things you ate today" or "what's the oldest thing you're wearing today?" I know what you're thinking: is there a question for February 29? Yes there is: "Leap year? What did you do with the extra day?"

The creators of the journal tapped into something really important: we all have a mission. Or at least, we're all called to have a mission. It's something that is easy to miss or forget or overlook. I think it's safe to say that most people, even most Christians, even some pastors (*ahem*) go through life without putting a lot of thought into the answer to the question "what is your mission?"

In Luke 4:14-21, Jesus answered the question "what is your mission?" It was the beginning of his ministry, he had just been baptized and spent forty days in the wilderness, he had been preaching and teaching around Galilee and then he came back to his hometown of Nazareth and was asked to teach in the synagogue. He reads this from the scroll of Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Then he said, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." He told them that God has anointed him to bring good news to the poor. Jesus was very clear regarding what his mission was. And he did it.

This last couple weeks I've been thinking a lot about "mission" in terms of each of us having our own personal mission. I believe each of us has a mission, a reason for being, a call to answer. No one is too young or too old to have a mission. No one too sick or too busy. We all have a mission we are called to serve. So I return to the question: what is your mission?

There will be at least as many different answers as there are people who answer. If you're like me, your statement of your mission might feel extremely personal and private. Or it maybe it's not. Maybe it's something you'd be happy to put on a bumper sticker, proclaiming to the world. Either way, I hope you will continue to consider your personal mission. And commit yourself to living it out. Every day. For the rest of your life.

Annual Meeting

Forty-two people attended the potluck luncheon and Annual meeting following worship on Sunday. January 31. During the meeting, attendees received the Annual Report, giving reports from the various committees within the church. Mickey Van Baale, outgoing clerk, verbally gave the Clerk's report. In the absence of Treasurer Cheryl Ritter, Jonnie Carpenter, chair of Budget and Finance, went over the finances of 2015 and the budget for 2016. Following her report, Tom Mott of the Personnel committee told of the proposed increase in Rev. Meghan Davis' package. During the time for questions and comments, Rev. Davis left the room and remained out of the room for the vote, which unanimously passed. Upon her return, Meghan asked for Jane Repp to give the report of the Foundation. The meeting was then turned over to Terry Rickers, outgoing Chairperson of the Corporation. If you were unable to attend and would like a copy of the Annual Report, there are extra copies on the table across from the office in the Narthex.

Budget and Finance Corner

Pledges for the month of December were \$13,194. This was \$1,376 above the amount we had budgeted. Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$280 for the month. In total for the month, expenses were \$4,048 under budget. Year-to-date pledges are \$11,963 over budget and year-to-date expenses are \$1,569 over budget.

During 2015, we received prepaid pledges for 2016 in the amount of \$19,632. These will be counted as pledge income during 2016. The Kitchen Remodeling fund received a contribution of \$900. The Muñoces fund received \$75 for donations and craft sales. We received a total of \$695 for the Christmas Joy offering, which will be remitted to Presbytery in January. In December, we remitted the Rural Harvest offering to Presbytery.

Local:

<u>Mission Coalition</u>: Marilyn McCallister reported that the Way of the Cross Walk will be on Friday, March 25, 2016. Linda Curtis-Stolper has agreed to coordinate the walk again this year.

Jasper County Kids Against Hunger: John Taylor. reported that there hasn't been a date set for the next meal packing session. As soon as he hears anything, he'll let us know.

Potential Mission Project: Mickey Van Baale had a list of things that need to be done to fix up the Friendship House. The current uses of the Friendship House are: weekly Youth Downtown, non-profit Kid Assist office space, and basic storage. Potential uses of the space could include disaster emergency housing, housing for work week groups on their way to a final destination, and temporary housing – ex. new pastor housing until permanent housing is found. A washer and dryer are in the basement but not hooked up. A needed stove and refrigerator for the kitchen has been donated, but the kitchen is not in good condition to move the items there. A mission project coordinator/manager is needed to determine the work that needs to be done, the skills needed, and an estimate of the cost involved for funding. Once estimated costs are known, Mickey will contact Building & Grounds Committee. Barb Taylor suggested that the Mariners in Mission could be contacted to work on the project. They have plumbers and electricians in their group. The group also felt that the youth from the Youth Downtown group should be asked to help, as well as the members of our church. Possible sources of funds for the materials could be from the money left from the Power bequest and money that was given by the Swanger family for remodeling the tower, which cannot be done.

Salvation Army Angel Tree: Thirty eight "angels" were provided gifts by the congregation.

A major drought destroyed most of the crop in 2015 so the families, all of whom depend on the harvest for their own sustenance as well as income, are particularly concerned with achieving a successful harvest in 2016. Because of this they have requested both pre-emergent and post-emergent fertilizers. The cost per family would be about \$80 to \$90 for both bags of fertilizer, with a cost for the entire community of \$3000, plus or minus \$300.
