

SUDANESE MINISTRY



Warren Erickson has had further contact with Ekram Kachu, Pastor of the Sudanese congregation in Des Moines (officially First Arabic Presbyterian Church). Ms. Kachu is eager to visit our congregation, and we discussed a possible date for her visit. Rev. Davis suggested that we invite her to preach the sermon and tell us more about the present situation in Sudan, the Des Moines congregation and its worship services, her own personal story of immigration to the United States, and her experience as a refugee in this

country. We will also invite her to stay after church for a simple soup-and-sandwich type of meal with interested members of our congregation. We also hope she may be able to encourage and inform us of ways in which we can be supportive to Sudanese members of our own community. Warren will talk with her again to extend these invitations, and we will let our congregation know when we may expect this interesting and informative visitor to worship with us.

Budget and Finance Corner

Operating Revenue and Expenses for month:

- Pledges for the month of November were \$6,785. This was \$3,859 below budget for the month.
- Other Regular Giving, which represents donations from people who tithe, but do not pledge, was \$1,565 for the month, which was \$829 above budget.

Other Income for the month:

- The church received settlement of the Noel Burton trust, in the amount of \$3,721.29. This donation will be transferred to the Foundation, in accordance with the Foundation guidelines.
- ♦ Prepaid 2018 pledges were received in the amount of \$5,159.78. This will be transferred to the 2018 pledge account in January.
- ♦ The Capital Development Maintenance fund received \$3,850 income from the Foundation earnings.

Expenses for the month:

- **♦ Administrative Expense was \$164.73 above budget due to the purchase of some software.**
- ♦ Building and Grounds Expense was \$108.61 above budget due to billing for lawn mowing done in previous months.
- ♦ The Deacons made donations to Neighbors Helping Neighbors for \$200, Salvation Army for \$200 and Friends in Hope for \$100.
- ♦ The Rural Harvest Special Offering collected an additional \$50. The total collection of \$355 will be remitted to Presbytery in December.
- The Undesignated Mission fund paid \$300 for Rain Forest wreaths, which will be resold to church members. It also paid \$1,881.52 for expenses related to the ramp building ministry.

In total for the month, expenses were \$134.70 below budget.

Year-to-date through November:

- ♦ Pledges are \$2,795 under budget.
- ♦ Other Regular Giving is \$3,581 over budget.
- ♦ Expenses are \$736 over budget.

For the year, the church is experiencing a shortfall of \$15,592. The 2017 anticipated annual shortfall was \$26,417.



Mission Committee

We would like to thank all the members who helped others on behalf of our church during the month of December. We had 25 angels from the Salvation Army that gifts were purchased for. Eight people from Progress Industries enjoyed a Christmas gift. We had bell ringers for the Salvation Army, and donations of food for the Salvation Army. Also to those who might have helped or made donations toward Neighbors Helping Neighbors or Friends in Hope.

Some of the members who built the ramp at Charlie Brown's home, went caroling to their home the Friday before Christmas. Plans had been to also carol at the home in Colfax where a ramp was built, but a date could not be found that worked out for all involved.

Days for Girls International workshops continue – The sustainable feminine hygiene kit allows a girl continue in school when she normally would have to spend a week each month confined to her home. At our last workshop, one complete kit was assembled. Our next workshop will be Thursday, January 26 from 9 am – 3 pm in fellowship hall with a delicious crock pot lunch provided. (Thank you, Linda Curtis-Stolper.) Our goal is to assemble more kits to be taken to Africa in February by our trainer, Kay Hertz of Des Moines. Donations of colorful underwear (girl's sizes 10-16 and women's sizes 5 & 6) are needed. All are welcome to participate in this great mission project.

Watch for information about Blue Sunday on February 11. This is when we celebrate the work of PDA (Presbytery Disaster Assistance). Barb Taylor will be heading up this celebration and there will be more details as the date gets closer.

John and Barb Taylor toured Dickenson, Texas First Presbyterian Church, while visiting their daughter, Marilee and family over Thanksgiving. This is the church Marilee and her family attend and it was flooded during Hurricane Harvey. Work is going well in cleaning up the damage and donations have been coming in from churches, not only in Texas, but nation wide. Our committee have offered to help if we can in some way. Marilee will keep her parents updated on what needs there might be. One idea we had was Sunday School curriculum that we have stored. Clean-up and groups of volunteers that have helped are a direct result of PDA in action.

The final figures are in and a total of \$981.75 was raised at the Luncheon and Style show. This amount was split between the ramp building project and half to PDA.

The total raised by The Rural Harvest offering was \$355.00.

At the writing of this article, money is still being received for the Christmas Joy Offering. Once we know the final amount, we will let you know. Thank you to those who have donated.

We ordered 25 Eco-Palm Presbyterian Hunger Program Christmas wreaths. All were picked up and paid for. Another thank you to those who participated.

The committee voted to donate \$100 to Neighbors Helping Neighbors and \$100 to Friends in Hope.
