

## Message from Pastor John

Blessings to all in the love of our Lord Jesus!

The journey of this congregation's future has taken a new turn. The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) had its Church Information Form (CIF) approved and is online. It is a matter of time before they start receiving Personal Information Forms (PIFs) of potential candidates. Keep this congregation in prayer, for the call is a mutual call for both this congregation and the person receiving the call.

To help us reflect on what that call means, let's look at the call of the prophet Jeremiah. The New Living Translation records in Jeremiah 1:4-10:

4The Lord gave me this message: 5"I knew you before I formed you in your mother's womb. Before you were born I set you apart and appointed you as my prophet to the nations." 6"O Sovereign Lord," I said, "I can't speak for you! I'm too young!" 7The Lord replied, "Don't say, 'I'm too young,' for you must go wherever I send you and say whatever I tell you. 8And don't be afraid of the people, for I will be with you and will protect you. I, the Lord, have spoken!". 9Then the Lord reached out and touched my mouth and said, "Look. I have put my words in your mouth! 10Today I appoint you to stand up against nations and kingdoms. Some you must uproot and tear down, destroy and overthrow. Others you must build up and plant."

First, God consecrated each party – knowing them before they were born or organized. Each has been set aside for God's purpose and pleasure. Hence, God knew First Presbyterian Church of Newton and has already an idea of what this congregational family needs. There is a person set aside for this congregation and this congregation set aside for that person who will be called.

Second, trust the calling process to happen. Don't make any excuses! Don't get too impatient! Jeremiah was making excuses for his youthful age, but God challenged him to not be so dismissive of his gifts. God is using whoever God will choose to be the best match. Don't fall into the human trap of saying, "We only have so many young families!" "We are an older congregation." Don't even think, "Well who would want to come to Newton, lowa?" Even Hollywood asked the question in, Field of Dreams, "Is this Heaven? No, it's lowa!" So, no excuses and trust the calling process to happen! God is with you all the way.

Finally, God commissions this congregation and the person God chooses. God appoints – commissions – everyone to be God's voice, minister, and co-servant with whomever God calls to serve as pastor. Our Lord also commissioned His disciples in Matthew 28 to go and make disciples, to baptize and to teach. The work and ministry of the church goes on and God will be with us as Jesus promised that He would be with us "even to the close of the age."

Oh, how exciting the next few months will be as we see this call take shape!

#### Local:

- **+ Summer Wednesday night dinners:** See the special article below.
- ♣ Backpack Buddies: First Presbyterian will pack bags one time next school year. This is a program coordinated through Mission Coalition and Berg and Thomas Jefferson elementary schools. Children, selected by their teachers, confidentially receive a bag of food each Friday. This is for children who have financial help with lunches through the school year and likely are not getting sufficient meals on the weekends. We will need 8-10 people for an hour or an hour and a half. Linda Curtis Stolper will facilitate this project.
- **+ Kid Assist** held an open house for the community on May 15 and an open house for the church after worship on May 19. Congratulations to Linda and the board members of Kid Assist for several years of success.
- **★** John Taylor helped with the **Jasper County Kids Against Hunger** project at the High School on May 1.

#### National:

- + First Presbyterian members generated \$689.78 for **One Great Hour of Sharing** this year.

#### International:

- ★ We enjoyed presentations by Rev. Katherine Pater, mission co-worker in El Salvador, at Sunday School and church on April 28 and at Women's Bible Study on May 1. The El Salvador interest group hosted lunch for Katherine following worship on April 28.
- ◆ Some members of First Presbyterian may be solicited by **Companeros** for contributions to help support the work of the Pastoral team in El Salvador. It is hoped that contributions to Companeros will not undercut contributions to our projects at First Presbyterian. Fund-raising will need to begin soon for additional **water tanks** for Muñoces before the rainy season ends. They need 16 more tanks to see that each family has one.
- **★** Linda Anderson will approach **Bridgestone Coffee House** to see if they have an interest in selling Don Justo coffee from the El Salvador project in their store.

First Presbyterian will be participating in the Community meals this summer. If you are not familiar with this program, it has been held at First United Methodist on Wednesday nights as a free meal for those wanting socialization and needing a meal. The summer program is being held at Sacred Heart Church. We were asked to help during the summer. Mission committee agreed to give it a try. There will be 4 churches participating which gives us 2 Wednesday nights during the summer. We have been assigned July 17 and July 31. The meals are simple, but we will need to provide about 4 hours in the afternoon for preparation and about 3 hours in the evening for serving and cleanup. Disposable plates will be used so dishwashing will be at a minimum. Plans are for about 100 people being served each Wednesday. When you are contacted by a member of the Mission committee to help, please say YES so we can assist some of our needy community members to have an enjoyable evening. There will be sign up sheets in the kitchen. We will be providing the menu weekly in case there are any of our members or guests who would enjoy an evening with others.

The last meal of the summer will be August 14 which will involve all 4 churches. It will be a salad supper so we will be asking for donations of salads for that meal. The committee will do the preparation, but we will need donations.

## **Budget and Finance Corner**

Pledges for the month of April were \$12,494. This was \$744 above budget for the month. Other regular giving for the month ran above budget and was \$636 above budget for the month of April. Expenses were \$1,768 under budget for the month.

Year-to-date, pledges are \$2,711 higher than budgeted. Expenses are \$2,351 under budget.

The Memorial Fund received moneys in memory of Marv Munger and Darrell Achtemeier. The Deacon Fund received offerings of \$109.82 and made a \$200 contribution to the Salvation Army food bank. The Muñoces fund received income from a contribution of \$100 and \$50 from the sale of crafts. The moneys collected for the One Great Hour special offering (\$803.23, which is higher than earlier reported due to a later donation) will be remitted in May.

### Katelyn Camp, Collin Ferguson, Andi Hollenbeck, Peder Hopkins (center)



## **Scholarship Students from Muñoces!**

#### Meet William Alexander Rivas Dominguez

William is the son of Maria Alberta Rivas and Herman Dominguez. He has seven brothers and sisters. Although Herman only went through the third grade and Maria has not had any schooling, they are encouraging all their children to get as much education as they can. William is studying, with your help, at the high school in Berlin this year.

"Ladies and Gentlemen representatives of the First Presbyterian church my name is William Alexander Dominguez I am from Caserio los Muñoces Cantón El Tablón, city of Berlín, Department of Usulután. Dear and esteemed ladies and gentlemen representatives of the Church. The reason for the following is to ask you all for your help. That for few economic resources it makes it difficult for us to be able to study and I thank you very much that you could help me because I want to overcome and to be someone better in the future. And with your help I can do it. I hope that all-powerful God continues to pour many blessings on every one of you. In 2012 I finish 9th grade and in 2013 I want to study in the National Institute of Berlín. And I hope with your help I will be able to achieve what I want so much. The desire to overcome is in your hands, and I am counting on your support. Thank you!"



#### More general information about education in Berlin, El Salvador

There are three options for high school here in the Berlín area. At the local high school – "El Instituto" – there are two choices: a two year "General" education program for those that want to be done sooner or have hopes to go to university. There is also a three year "Vocational" program which provides a more specific education with a certificate in a trade of some sort: secretarial, computer, accounting, etc. When I receive the copies of their first grade reports in April, I will know which program each student is in. Some students chose to go to a high school program in Alegría (a 10 minutes up the road by bus). This is an intensive "Saturday only" program. This allows students to obtain their high school degree as well as help their families in their farms during the work week. It is a good option for those students who are also needed to support their families!

The grading system in El Salvador is based upon the numbers 1 through 10 – with ten being the best. You cannot pass a subject with a 5 or less. You CAN, however, move to the next grade level if you ended up with a 5 at the end of the year. You just need to either test out of that material the following year or re-take the class.

On behalf of the students, the Pastoral Team and myself, I want to thank you and the members of First Presbyterian Newton who are providing the gift of education to these students. Especially for students who live so far from town, the cost of transportation to and from Muñoces, or the other option of renting a room here in

Berlín during the week, would make it impossible to continue on with their education! This is an investment in the future. Not just for the student, but potentially for the community as these young people develop the confidence and skills to become leaders.
