Message from Pastor John

Dear Faith Family of First Presbyterian Church,

We continue on the Lenten Journey toward Jerusalem with our Lord Whose focus, mission and purpose is the Cross. There, it all comes to a climax. It will make sense when we get up on Easter morning to celebrate what that focus, mission, and purpose truly mean, Meanwhile, the journey moves on. Jesus was at such a junction of His Journey when on the Mount of Transfiguration. Look at Luke 9: 28-36 and recall the momentous encounter Jesus has with Elijah and Moses. The disciples are there, but not fully. They are sleeping and almost miss this extraordinary prayer summit with these Old Testament Heroes. The content of the discussion with Jesus, Elijah and Moses is what Jesus faces when He sets His focus on Jerusalem and ending at the cross. Nothing will distract Him from that objective.

This Lent, we are figuratively on the same journey with Jesus. Do we really think of that Journey for our own life direction? I challenge all of us to keep the focus, mission, and purpose of our Lord central in our thoughts on this journey to the Cross.

An example is when I take my weekly trips back and forth from Lincoln, Nebraska to Newton, Iowa. Along the interstate, there are two sights that I customarily look for as an assurance of being guided. One is about 42 miles from my apartment in Lincoln called the Holy Family Shrine, which is on the south side of I-80 between Lincoln and Omaha. It is quite modern looking with a chapel. In the front of the chapel is a crucifix which is a constant reminder for me of my Lord's sacrifice. I am reminded of His willingness to go the full journey for me and my life, my family, and the people whom I love and serve.

The second sight is on the north side of I-80 East bound just outside of Council Bluffs. It is the New Horizons Presbyterian Church. That church is a recent merger of 1st Presbyterian Church and Grace Presbyterian Church of Council Bluffs. The New Horizons Church reminds me of what lies ahead of my journey with Jesus. So, coming or going home, I see these two sights as a constant reminder of Jesus' ultimate sacrifice and His ongoing victory and assurance of New Horizons to come.

On your journey – let your focus, mission, and purpose be like Jesus. Find the assurance of His guidance and sacrifice, but also His victory and ongoing promise of a glorious future that we celebrate on Easter Morning. Meanwhile, the journey continues to the Cross.

Budget and Finance Corner

For the month of January, pledges were \$34,663, which included pledges of \$19,000 that were prepaid in 2012. This was \$3,913 higher than budget. Other regular giving, at \$1,340, was higher than budget by \$1041. Building & Grounds expenses were above budget by \$114.50 due to snow removal expenses and utilities that were higher than budgeted. Personnel expenses were under budget \$399.55 due to pastor mileage expense that was lower than budgeted for the month. In total, expenses were \$505 under budget for the month.

Shoe Box Ministry

Kelly Koenen received a recap on the "Shoe Box" ministry that our church participated in. Central lowa donated 24,000 boxes & over 9 million boxes were delivered worldwide. Our church donated 32 boxes and enough cash to cover shipping (\$7/box) plus extra. Very impressive figures for a worthwhile cause.

Adult Education Podcasts

Larry Anderson will offer the "civil conversations" series podcasts as an adult education opportunity in the church. Please join me for Lenten exploration of the Practice of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a method of **silent** prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer, prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship.

Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth of meaning to all prayer and facilitates the movement from more active modes of prayer - verbal, mental or affective prayer - into a receptive prayer of resting in God. Centering Prayer emphasizes prayer as a personal relationship with God and as a movement beyond conversation with Christ to communion with Him

We will meet at 6:15 in the Church Parlor of 1st Presbyterian Church, Newton on Thursday evenings of Lent starting Thursday 2/28. We will start with a brief introduction to Centering Prayer followed by a period of silent prayer. The session will be over by 6:45 pm.

THE WORKINGS OF THE CHURCH The Congregation

Previous contributions to this series have discussed the workings, purpose and authority (if any) of the Deacons and Session and touched on the process of calling a Teaching Elder. Staying on the local level for at least one more installment, the next question is, what about the 400 pound robin sitting there in the room? You know, the people, the congregation. What is their role in all this? After all, aren't they *The Church*? Do they have any responsibilities beyond showing up at least twice a year, maybe writing a check or 2 and knowing when to sit and when to stand? Is there more to it than that?

Well lucky us! We have a Book of Order, a constitution of sorts that tells us much about what's expected of members of the PC(USA) and specifically, First Presbyterian Newton. (We're also referred to as "Newton First" around the Des Moines Presbytery.)

So who is "the congregation?" According to the Book of Order (para G-7.03)

The congregation is made up of all members on the active roll of a particular church and all such members who are present at a congregational meeting are entitled to vote.

To be on the "active roll" at 1PC we consider all forms of participation. The Book of Order says "An active member of a particular church is a person who has made a profession of faith in Christ, has been baptized, has been received into membership of the church, has voluntarily submitted to the government of this church, and participates in the church's work and worship." At 1PC we don't think you have to be a "big giver" or on Session. You don't have to be in the pews every Sunday or sing in the choir. You just have to be active at whatever level you want. We accept you and welcome you here.

OK – so what else is required of the congregation? We probably all know that meetings of the congregation can be called by the session or the presbytery, but did you know a request from one-fourth of the active members can also cause a meeting to be held? Paragraph G-7.0303 - How Meetings Are Called.

The Book of Order contains a lengthy list of authorized reasons why a meeting might be called. For example, buying or selling property, calling Pastors, electing Elders and Deacons, and changes to the call of the pastor are all valid reasons. Calling of the meeting can start with the congregation.

Here's a significant responsibility each of us shares: "The congregation shall welcome all persons who respond in trust and obedience to God's grace in Jesus Christ and desire to become part of the membership and ministry of his Church." That speaks volumes about our work here. It's found in paragraph G-5.0103. It goes on to state "Each member must seek the grace of openness in extending the fellowship of Christ to all persons . . . Failure to do so constitutes a rejection of Christ himself and causes a scandal to the gospel."

Both the nominating committee which names members to be Elders and Deacons as well as the Pastor Nominating Committee are elected by the congregation. During the ordination and installation service for Deacons and Elders, the congregation is asked these questions:

". . Do we, the members of the church, accept (names) as elders or deacons as chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Do we agree to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?"

Again, some pretty interesting commitments by the members of the church.

The last, and most obvious, responsibility of the congregation is to support the work of the church. At Newton First we have a rather unique committee structure that gives everyone an opportunity to participate. Our committees are open to any member who wants to contribute their time and effort. Whether it's baking cookies, helping with the annual audit, helping monitor the condition of our building or . . . The opportunities to be part of our church family are almost limitless.

We are truly blessed as we "Raise Our Eyes to the Future".
