Days for Girls International – Newton, IA Team Update!

Our Newton, IA Team participated in the Jordan Humanitarian Response. Jordan covers an area of 34,495 square miles and houses a population of 10 million people (majority Jordanian and Palestinian). The majority of the population is Muslim (95%). Jordan is home to approximately 2.3 million Palestinian refugees who arrived as a result of both the 1947-49 Palestine war and the Six Day War in 1967. There are also over 670,500 Syrian refugees. It has received the second highest number of refugees in proportion to its population in the world, behind Lebanon. Since the mid 1990's, Jordan has faced recession, debt, and unemployment that has been exacerbated by large numbers of refugees. As a result, a number of social groups, including Jordanians, refugees, and other marginalized populations are in need of support accessing menstrual care solutions and







Four team members (Julie Fisher, Linda Curtis-Stolper, Rose Evans, Marilyn McCallister) were able to join together on Thursday, October 14 to prepare the DfG kit components listed below. Julie Fisher delivered the components to our collection point in Liberty, Missouri on Friday, October 15.

- 102 shields (enough for 51 kits)
- 477 liners (enough for almost 60 kits)
- 114 drawstring bags (1 bag per kit)
- 228 underwear-various sizes (enough for 114 kits)
- 200 washcloths (1 washcloth per kit)
