Little Church will no longer be offered. The Nursery will be maintained during the worship service for babies and young children. Plans for older children, through fifth grade, not attending worship are still under discussion. Children in sixth grade and older will be expected to attend church.

The Membership Committee organized and hosted a committee head meeting after church on September 22 with representatives of all session committees and deacons present. Linda Campbell reported she had met with J and B Services regarding trimming the hornbeams in the front. They stated that if they trimmed the trees away from the building, in 2 years they would need it again. They recommended removing the trees and gave a tentative quote of "2 or 3 hundred" to do that. It is the committee's idea that they can do that themselves and save us some money.

Larry DeCook will investigate what to do about the kitchen door to strip and paint it. There is some concern about being without a secure door overnight.

Linda Campbell is waiting on a recommendation from Kathy Ventling as to a color scheme and plan on painting the kitchen. Marie Achtemeier has provided the funds.

Bret Doerring reported that Russell will re-stripe the parking lot for about \$400. This includes prep of the surface. We have 6 designated handicapped spots which increases the quote considerably (seems painting little wheel chairs is expensive!) Bret will get a firm quote. We debated the question of doing the re-striping this fall or waiting until spring. We will make the decision after we get the quote.


Roger Harmelink said the leftover carpet from Fellowship hall is stored in the janitor's closet. We will attempt to get it labeled and stored under the east stairs off the kitchen.

Larry Decook has consulted with Gardner's Millwork regarding the front doors. He got a quote of \$1639 for about the same doors as we now have, which are unsatisfactory. He will do some more inquiring about solid steel doors that are strong enough to hold a closer and not leak cold air.

Les Gause reported that he has a bid for \$2600 to re do the front walk. However the front steps will very soon need some major and very expensive repair, and that repair will without a doubt cause the walk to need to be torn up. We decided to wait on walk repair.

Pledges for the month of August were \$9,9472. This was \$1,808 below budget for the month. Other Regular Giving was \$210, slightly below budget for the month of August, but still ahead of budget for the year. Total expenses were \$2785.82 below budget for the month.

Year-to-date figures through August show pledges to be \$4,910 below budget and expenses \$8,530 under budget.

The church received a generous gift from the Jean Power estate. Part of the gift, which was not designated to a particular fund, will go to the Foundation, as has been our practice in the past. Jean requested that the remaining amount be used for benevolences, which are yet to be decided.

Last year, of the three students completing 6th grade, two continued on to middle school. Often the students are older...14 to 16 years old...when they complete 6th grade and they are expected to join their fathers in the field or their mothers with the work at home. We would like to celebrate their accomplishments as well as encourage them to continue on to middle school in El Tablon by sending them some congratulatory cards from our congregation. Last year some of us tucked a \$1 bill in each card as a special treat! Cards will be available in the next few weeks so that you can sign your name and maybe tuck a dollar in your card. Thanks again for your support!
