

Message from Pastor Linda

September is always an exciting, busy time of year. Change is in the air! As First Presbyterian Church enters September, 2013, we are facing many possibilities and adjustments even as we revert to familiar procedures. Consider:

- * Worship will have a 10:25am starting time on September 8. If you missed worship due to travels and gatherings during the summer, now is the time to reclaim Sunday morning for church and invite a friend to come, too. When someone new comes to our services, introduce yourself and make the stranger feel welcome
- * Choir anthems return to our worship services. Thank you to those who supplied special music during the summer. The choir is always eager to welcome new members, of all ages and vocal ranges.
- * Our middle school and high school youth are making plans to come together regularly for fellowship, for service, and for faith formation. Look for a representative of that group as worship leader on the second Sunday of every month.
- * The Church Life Committee has planned monthly events to offer different ways for members of our church family to celebrate life together. If you have a suggestion for a new activity, they'd like to hear it.
- * The Christian Nurture Committee is engaged in exploration and research, attempting to find a new model for Sunday School classes that can offer opportunities for more of us, of all ages, to participate in sharing ourselves and our faith with each other. - * The Mission Committee has agreed that we are going to help prepare community meals on the fourth Wednesday of every month. Volunteers are needed to prepare the food and to serve and clean up. When can you help?
- * Planning for new events to raise funds to support our sister parish of Muñoces, El Salvador is under way. Persons interested in traveling to Muñoces next spring are being sought.
- * And, of course, we continue to lift up the Pastor Nominating Committee in our prayers as they devote great energy and time on our behalf to the search for a new fulltime pastor to lead us into the future.

Did you notice the common factor in all the items listed above? They all involve action - people doing things to participate in the life and work of the church. That's what we have all been commissioned to do - something to further the growth of the body of Jesus Christ. The NRSV Bible in the pews translates Jesus' commission as, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." The Message has Jesus saying, "Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near."

The questions for each one of us are, "What can I do?" and, more importantly, "What will I do?" We are all part of the body of Christ in this place, which means every one of us has been directed by Jesus to find some way of actively participating in the work of the church. Prayerfully consider the possibilities above. If the Holy Spirit doesn't lead you to any of them, find another way of getting involved. There's work to be done, and we've been commissioned to do it. Changes on Sundays

Starting Sunday, September 8, announcements will begin promptly at 10:25. Be sure you are in the sanctuary before that time if you have an announcement to make or if you wish to hear the announcements! We have listed our worship time as being 10:25 during much of the year for many years, but the worship frequently hasn't started at that time. This change is being made so that important information can be shared with the congregation without taking away from the actual time and thought we spend in worship.

Announcements will be made from 10:25-10:30 am.. The invitation to "prepare our hearts for worship" and the Prelude will begin at 10:30.

Another change will begin at the end of the service on September 8. Worship services end with the pastor giving the congregation a "charge" - encouragement as we go out into the world - and a benediction - a blessing to carry with you as you leave. In response to the benediction, the congregation is encouraged to say, with enthusiasm and gratitude to God, "Alleluia! Amen." It will be printed in the bulletin. Please join in expressing your thanks for God's gracious gift of time in worship through this response. Following the congregation's response, the choir will deliver a choral blessing before the postlude begins.

Budget and Finance Corner

Pledges for the month of July were \$9,886. This was \$1,864 below budget for the month. Other Regular Giving for the month continues to run above budget and was \$381 above budget for the month of July. Total expenses were \$2,083 below budget for the month.

Year-to-date figures through July show pledges to be \$3,102 below budget and expenses \$5,564 under budget. It is not unusual for pledges to fall behind during the summer months and it is why Budget and Finance encourage everyone to use the automatic deduction option from your banking account.

The Foundation received a \$5,000 contribution.

Mission Committee

Out of Our Abundance, Gifts of Grace

First Presbyterian funds several projects in the small community of Muñoces, El Salvador. These projects are the result of meetings of the directiva (think "city council") of the community in consultation with the leaders of Our Sister Parish (the Pastoral team which includes Des Moines Presbytery mission co-worker, Katherine Pater). The needs in the community are great and ongoing so the directiva has to prioritize and make difficult decisions about which projects are most important to the community. The Pastoral team works with the leadership in the community to scrutinize each project, assuring that all funds are used most effectively. After that process is completed the requests for assistance are sent to First Presbyterian where we attempt to respond with friendship and financial assistance. Several of the projects currently in need of funds are:

Water tanks: In 2012 we purchased 24 water tanks for the community, which the directiva distributed among the families. There are still 16 families that do not have a water tank. If we can purchase these tanks before the end of the rainy season (November) they can fill them with rain water to help throughout the long, dry summer. A trip to the nearest water source is about 1 mile round trip...steeply down and returning just as steeply up carrying heavy water jugs! Cost: \$110 to \$120 per tank.

Scholarships: Young people in Muñoces can attend kindergarten through 6th grade in Muñoces and then need to walk a mile to El Tablón for grades 7 and 8. If they wish to extend their education beyond 8th grade they must go to the high school in Berlin which requires a place to stay during the week in town. We are assisting any student who wishes to continue their education into high school with a scholarship. The scholarship does not cover all expenses but is enough to encourage students and their families to commit to more education. Currently we are sponsoring 5 high school students. Student grades and attendance are reviewed at semester before 2nd semester scholarships are paid. Cost: \$100 per student per year, paid in two installments.

Fertilizer: Each year we have been asked to assist with the purchase of fertilizer. Every family in the community is dependent on agriculture and the use of fertilizer helps increase the yield and therefore, the income of each family. The fields are farmed by hand, using pickaxes and hoes, and is backbreaking work. Our Sister Parish is working with the farmers to learn about natural fertilizers and insecticides but until (and if) that is practical we will be asked to assist with fertilizer. Cost: \$50 to \$75 per bag.

Health care: Residents in the community who have a health care need they cannot afford can take that need to the directiva for possible help through Our Sister Parish. Health care in El Salvador is very affordable by U.S. standards but often out of the reach of subsistence farmers such as the families in Muñoces. A recent example is that of a 4-year-old girl who injured her eye and needed eye surgery to save the vision in that eye. The cost of the surgery is less than \$500 and we have agreed to help the family pay. Most requests for assistance with health care needs are in the \$5 to \$25 range. We are always in need of money to replenish this fund. Cost: any amount would help.

So we are asking for your assistance. We hope to buy the remaining water tanks this fall but will not need the scholarship or fertilizer funds until 2014. The health care needs are ongoing. Please consider a gift to the El Salvador fund to help with these projects. Perhaps you could contribute the cost of a water tank this month and give a scholarship or a bag of fertilizer in the months to come. Any amount will be helpful. We would like your contributions by September 15, if possible, and hope that you can help. Checks can be made to First Presbyterian Church with "El Salvador fund" on the memo line. Sharing from your abundance will not only provide a gift to our friends in Muñoces but will also be satisfying to you. 100% of your gift will go to these projects and you can see the pictures of the recipients and know that you have improved what is, and will continue to be, a very challenging life for our friends in El Salvador. Thanks!

Scholarship Students from Muñoces!

Meet Gerber Antonio Mejia Gonzalez

Gerber Antonio is the 5th of our 5 scholarship students from Muñoces to introduce to you. Gerber is being raised by his grandmother, Maria Ignacia Munoz, after she raised 7 children of her own. Two of her children, Roberto and Renee, have become leaders in the community. When her husband left her with 7 children to raise she went out into the fields herself and completed the difficult work of raising corn and beans by hand to feed her family. Now she wishes her grandson to complete his education. Here is her letter of application on his behalf.

Community of Munoz. Receive a friendly greeting on the part of Maria Ignacia Munoz, wishing you success in your daily labors and that God always keeps you in good health. The reason for the present letter is to ask you all for your great economic help for my grandson Gerber Antonio Mejia Gonzalez who wants to complete his baccalaureate studies at the National Institute of Berlin. He graduated from the 9th grade in the central school of El Tablon in 2009 and because of my health and economic state he has not been able to continue his studies because to go down from the community towards Berlin is a great distance and sometimes dangerous and not having a way to go it is necessary to rent a humble room to stay. Hoping for your welcome understanding. Many thanks. May God bless every one of you.
